## WANT A CLUB SHOOT? CALL ME!

The second Sunday is normally reserved for the Club Shoot. We will now be shooting the club shoot by appointment. Call two of your friends or call me. If there are at least 3 shooters, I will come out.

The Club Shoot is comprised of the 28 targets on the outdoor range and is currently shot from the Red Stakes on Targets 1-14 and the White stakes on Targets 15-28. You place yourself in a shooting class (A, B, or C) by shooting the Club Shoot a minimum of three times. Scores from this shoot also place you on the Outdoor Board (the one in the back of the club house). For an official shoot, you need to shoot the entire round in the same day with a group of at least three, using dual scoring.

Reminder to all outdoor archers that the trail between Targets 21 and 22 gets really slippery after it rains, particularly right before the 80-yard platform, so tread carefully.



Depending on the weather, this month's work items may include: (1) removing Scotch broom from the firing lanes on Targets 12 and 13, (2) replacing the bale on the 28-cub target, (3) fixing the bridge railing at the end of Target 28 (bottom of the hill), (4) fixing the bridge between the Target 28 firing stakes and the target stands, and/or (5) replanting a firing stake or two on Target 1.

*Old Business*

1. New member! Julia Etow took an archery class in high school. Saw our class listed in Parks & Rec a few years ago but then the class was cancelled. She's finally hooking up with us. Wants to be a working member. Has two kids who are kinda interested, ages 7 and 11. We vote. Unanimous approval. Welcome!



2. Work party this Saturday. Jerry & Cindee will call working members. Lunch to be served! Andy will manage the work party; Susan will manage lunch.

3. Stickbow and 3D in the Redwoods shoots are June 4 & 5. Our flier is ready for the CBH newsletter. We've created a single-page ad, which is what we did last year. Should we submit it for 2 months (April & May)? Consensus is 2 months if we haven't missed the deadline for the April issue.

4. We need someone to print and distribute fliers in archery and sporting goods shops and Parks & Rec in SC, Capitola, Scotts Valley, Aptos. Henry will print; Andy and Jerry will distribute.

5. Create second page of flier for web download containing typical sign-up sheet. No one here tonight to ask about it.



6. We sometimes need to approve expenditures in a rush, and there's not time to wait for the monthly meeting. Jerry moves that with the agreement of 3 officers or board members, up to \$500 in emergency expenditures can be approved and must be published in the newsletter. Gene seconds. Approved.

7. The January meeting was too long, and some discussions were very long. Last month we talked about creating formal guidelines for the length of discussions. A long discussion ensues. We would like to keep meetings short and focused, but we want everyone to have a chance to say what they think. Gene moves that in the interest of keeping meetings focused, we limit officers reports to 5 minutes or less and limit new proposals to 5 minutes max; for discussions, to decide how long each person can speak, we divide 15 minutes by the number of speakers; after a 15-minute discussion, a 2/3 majority vote is required to continue the discussion. Andy seconds. Approved.

8. Dues and membership changes. Here we get to test the new policy we just created. We have an outstanding proposal to change the dues structure. This meeting has already gone on a long time, and any change we make to the dues will not take effect until November. Henry notes that we'll have more time at next month's meeting to discuss the dues. Jack moves that we postpone the discussion until next month. Mark seconds. A 2/3 majority is required to postpone the discussion. 10 yes votes out of 14 members present. Passes. Tune in next month.

9. Henry is interested in mailing the newsletter (currently we publish it on the web site and email it to members without email access). Many clubs mail a printed copy. Henry guesses we could print and mail for \$100/month. He will look into it. The goal in getting the newsletter out there is to get people to take part in the club and to come to shoots.
