ARCHERY CLASSES PLANNED FOR CHALLENGED FOLKS

We are starting an exciting program at the archery range. Last fall, we were approached by Shared Adventures, a local non-profit organization that provides outdoor recreational activities for people with a wide range of ages and disabilities. Shared Adventures helps these folks get outside and do very cool stuff. They have been around almost 20 years, and have taken people out kayaking, horseback riding, sailing, and many other activities. They are interested in adding archery to their program and approached us for help and coaching.

Henry met at the range with Steve Miller and Foster Andersen. Steve works for Shared Adventures, and Foster is the founder of the organization. Foster was quite impressed that Henry was able to adapt a shooting style for him and had him slinging arrows in no time. Henry says,

“Foster really figured it out himself, holding the bow’s grip against his knee for support and keeping the bow somewhat horizontal.” Steve notes that “Foster was the perfect test case—it took an hour of adapting and practice for him to get his first bull’s eye—can’t ask for a more successful outcome than that (see attached pictures). I think the vision we have of a challenged archery class will be a great activity.” Steve expressed hope that some of the Shared Adventures “folks could integrate into the on-going club activities.”



Foster attended our December club meeting and spoke to the members. He recalls enjoying archery as a child. Support for the club is available in the form of adaptive equipment. The organization also has a staff and many volunteers. Our members are favorable to the idea. We are reviewing our tax status to ensure that adding this activity will keep us good standing with the IRS.

We are planning a set of classes occurring one Saturday morning per month for three months. The classes will be led by one of the SC Archers instructors. After the three-month trial period, the two groups will see what’s working and what isn’t and then adapt the program. Participants will be recruited and registered by Shared Adventures, and the class will be open

to any challenged individuals ages 10 and above.



In addition to starting an archery class at our local club, Shared Adventures is partnering with USPOC through Sacramento Parks & Recreation to establish themselves as a Paralympic Sport Club. They would like to add archery as an event. The Paralympics are held the same year and at the same venue as the Olympics and have the same Olympic events. What would the Olympics be without archery? Shared Adventures already has Paralympic athletes training for tennis, table tennis, and cycling.

President's Report (Henry Bertram)

2. The MOA has been submitted to the city; no comments as yet.

3. Club Elections are in November. Nominations are open. We will need to elect a new president. Steve Andrews was nominated (in his absence).

Treasurer's Report (Susan Bertram)
The club is solvent.

Outdoor Range Captain's Report (Andy Sterbenz)

1) We now have 5 gnome targets: 3 of the heavier foam and 2 softer targets for cubs. 2) Target 18 was repaired and re-banded last month. 3) For the work party, we have a new peg-bar ready to fix the broken bow rack on the practice range, and the firing lanes need to be cleared for next month's shoot. Focus on trimming limbs and trees, not weed-eating. 4) The platform on Target 14 will take some hours to replace. We have most of the materials on hand but it's probably more than we want to attempt this weekend.

Indoor Range Captain's Report (Cindee Damron)

1) Cindee hasn't been to the range much this month. 2) The drinking water is refilled. 3) Cindee will be defrosting the fridge. Do not put the bottled water in the freezer, it breaks the bottles and spills inside the fridge. 4) Jerry got the quad repaired for a total cost of \$42.39. It only needed a thermostat.

KeyMaster's Report (Randy Redmond)

Nothing to report.

Old Business

1. Roof quote. Brian Marsh, archer and general contractor, presented his proposal for repair of the indoor range roof. He identified areas where dry rot is occurring and the wood needs replacement, and places where the surface is good but the seams need to be sealed. Quote was \$4800 for the repair. The work would take less than a month to complete. There was general discussion about the age of the roof and the quality of the previous work. Neil moved that we accept the proposal, seconded by Jerry. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Working with the city to understand how to mitigate the erosion problem in and around the practice range, picnic area, and service road between picnic area and indoor range. Need to meet with the city's urban forester to discuss (Andy). No contact made yet.

3. Continue development of Mulligan process and stamp for future shoots (Jerry). Jerry had purchased a

Mulligan stamp for the club. Policy and pricing was discussed. The consensus was that Mulligans would be sold for the BBoB and SBITR/3DITR shoots only. Pricing would be \$2 each, 3 for \$5, and maximum 3 per archer.

4. Build or purchase firewood racks for the indoor range. Two will cost around \$283 (\$23 shipping).

(<http://www.plowearth.com/product.asp?pcode=8892>) Item was discussed. Jerry had recently stacked firewood indoors and all agreed the stack locked fine without a rack. Adding outdoor racks was briefly discussed. No action was taken.

5. Distribution of fliers for Bad Boys (sport shops, archery shops, help with mailing). Cindee has delivered flyers to Outdoor World. Archery shops and clubs had been covered. No further action required.

6. Drainage problem at rear of indoor range. John raised the idea of renting a trencher and installing a French drain and sump pump to address the seepage problem. There was a short discussion of what labor and materials would be involved. Henry asked John and Neil to develop a more detailed plan and bring it back at the next meeting. Jerry volunteered to help cost out the materials.

New Business

1. New member introductions and voting. Dennis Allen and family are moving back to the area from Southern California. Brian Marsh, bow-hunter and general contractor, was just hired to repair the roof. Approved unanimously.

Henry Bertram, Larry Yien, full slate elected 10-0.

2. We are hosting the State Indoor Championships mail-in tournament on January 14 at 10 a.m. We will need three judges to help run the event. Mike Tracy and Andy Sterbenz volunteered to help (but they need to be reminded).

3. Shared Adventures, a local non-profit organization that provides outdoor recreational activities for people with disabilities, is partnering with USPOC through Sacramento Parks & Recreation to create a Paralympic Sport Club. There is interest in an archery program in Santa Cruz, and they hope SC Archers would be able to provide some help. There are benefits including publicity and funding for equipment. Shared Adventures will attend our December meeting and provide a presentation. Generally positive discussion.

4. Drainage repair update. John gave an update on the proposed French drain for the building, which is still in the planning phase. No action required.

5. City Parks and Recreation Memo of Understanding. Henry is still working with the City on the MOU wording. The history of the club is now correct, but the City is insisting on a "defend and hold harmless" clause that exceeds what the club's insurance will cover. If anyone knows a lawyer who can translate common sense for us, let us know. Also, in working on this, Henry realizes we should be a 501.c.3 non-profit and not a 501.c.7 non-profit. If anyone knows how to change that tax status, please come forward.

New Business

1. New member introductions and voting. The Damhorst family, Kris, Darla, Jackson and Malenna applied to be working members. Kris swears he has an archery merit badge somewhere in his past. Jackson just likes to shoot things. Vote in unanimously.



2. Mike Tracy will replace the outdoor target faces this week.

Things are looking pretty good around the range after the big wind last week. The range could stand some raking. Along with the platform on 14, we also need to reset part of the retaining wall on the practice range.

KeyMaster's Report (Randy Redmond)

No report.

Old Business

1. Election results are in! Mike Tracy is our new President; Henry Bertram is assuming the job of 2nd VP. Steve Andrews is still the Secretary (better the devil you know?). Susan Bertram has remained the Treasurer. Andy Sterbenz continues as the Outdoor Range Captain. Jerry Granger and Cindee Damron will be the Indoor Range Co-Captains. Lynn Rollins remains as the Membership Chair and Newsletter Editor. Randy Redmond continues as the Keymaster. Robert Perry is still the Publicity Chair. Last, certainly not least, and the longest title in the club, Web Master and Brand Management and Marketing Chair has been retained by Sergey Gorbатов. Thank you all for your service.

2. We are hosting the Regional Indoor Championships and the State Indoor Championships. These are both 450 rounds, mail-in tournaments (18 meters, Vegas target, 3 arrows/end, 15 ends). Regional is December 11 at 1000, State is January 14 at 1000. Turnout may be on the light side for the regional.

New Business

1. New members! Marshall Carl grew up around here, works at Riverside Lighting, and is in school to become an electrician. He shoots a recurve and also has a compound. As is our custom, we vote as to whether to accept this person as a member of our

club. Unanimous approval. Welcome!



2. Please do not go left at the Y at the top of the hill. The city has repaired the road in that area, and it will wash away if it is driven on before the soil has a chance to compact properly. There is no archery that way anyway.

3. Henry attended the MTBA meeting, and the great thing is they all got out a big calendar and scheduled out the shoots, so there should be no conflicting dates to draw shooters away from each others' events. Our "...In the Redwoods" shoots will be June 2 and 3; "Bad Boys of Branciforte" will be October 7.

Henry also brought a few subjects back to the club for approval/denial. CBH would like to add a historian position. They would like to elect the 2nd VP in even years, rather than in odd years. They would like to get legal defense fund out of the general fund. They would like to remove the arbitrary "must shoot A score class" to win. They want to clarify shooting styles. They want to change the BHFS 5 sight pin limit to no pin limit. They also want no arrow speed limit; it would instead be a minimum arrow weight of 5 grains per pound of draw weight. Randy moves, Mike 2nds that we accept the recommendation of the board of presidents. 11 ayes, 1 abs. We began to give feedback when it was discovered that the "clarification of shooting styles" was unclear and confusing. We tabled the discussion, and Henry will circulate an e-mail about this. 4. Foster Anderson, representing Shared Adventures spoke to the members. Shared Adventures assists special needs folks to get outside and do very cool stuff. They have been

around almost 20 years, and have taken people out kayaking, horseback riding, sailing, and many other activities. They are establishing themselves as a Paralympics Sport Club and would like to add archery as an event. The Paralympics are held the same year and at the same venue as the Olympics, and have the same Olympic events. What would the Olympics be without archery? I shudder to think. Shared Adventures already has Paralympics athletes training for tennis, table tennis, and cycling. They would like to use our range and instructors for archery. Foster recalls enjoying archery as a child, and visited Henry up here at the range. Foster was quite impressed that Henry was able to adapt a shooting style for him and had him slinging arrows in no time. Bulls-eyes were had! Support for the club is available in the form of adaptive equipment. Foster also has a staff and many volunteers. Our members are favorable to the idea. Our club would need to change our tax structure status from social club to non-profit. We would also like to have a mechanism for evaluating the potential archers, and mentioned a possible train the trainer for the volunteers. The general feeling is about a max of 7 archers at a time, at about 1000-1200 on the weekends. Jerry, Mike and Denise are willing to assist. Foster has a contact we may be able to use to research switching to non-profit status. More to follow.

5. While there were no blow-downs on the range, there were plenty of blow-offs off the roof. Brian Marsh is here and has assessed the damage. He thinks about \$2500 will do a good job of repairing it, buy the materials, and get the old stuff hauled away. He may need volunteer help to get the roofing up on the roof and other such misc help. Randy moves, Andy 2nds to spend \$2500 to fix the roof. 11 ayes, 1 abs.

6. Randy feels the club needs more members. Randy moves, Denise 2nds to lower the key deposit. Discussion of numbers of members lost or unable to pay the deposit, how would we return

the extra money back to the people who have paid \$200, should we table for next year. 3 ayes, 4 noes, 3 abstain. No change.

7. Randy moves, Denise 2nds that dues be \$100 for non-working and \$100 for working members. Members who work would be rebated \$5 per hour worked off next year's dues. After 20 hours of work, the member's dues would be free. Members who work more than 20 hours could have the hours banked against future dues. Discussion. 3 ayes, 4 noes, 3 abstain. No change.
